If you have any interest in singing please prayerfully consider joining our choir family. I have listed below just a few good reasons you might consider.

The human voice is a God given musical instrument that is to be treasured. To many who don't sing in the choir, the thought of choral singing may seem like a scary and impossible task, particularly if they can't read music. But, with that in mind here are a few thoughts about joining the choir.

The sum is better than one... The amazing thing about church choirs is most people in the choir have no musical training and are not great soloists. That's why we have choir rehearsal! We usually work five weeks ahead, and that means, when we present an anthem on Sunday, we have spent five rehearsals preparing that anthem. It always amazes me how every Sunday the hard work, the confidence, and the Holy Spirit all combine to make a beautiful blend and harmony of our many voices.

The social benefits are awesome... Membership in the chancel choir will enhance your circle of friends. There is a marvelous bond formed between musicians in the choir. As we learn music and perform that music, we learn to depend and trust those in the choir. The choir is a small group and you get to know each other in a more intimate setting as we meet each week.

There are also health benefits... Singing in a group is an ideal way to relax and relieve stress. It provides an outlet from the pressures of everyday life. Most all of us who come to Wednesday rehearsals agree that choir practice is our drug of choice for midweek relief of stress and pressures of life.

The main requirement to sing in the choir is to have the ability to sing in tune. Nearly everyone does this without even thinking about it. If you don't know what vocal part you sing, that is no problem. We will find just the right spot for you in our choir. Reading music is not required, you will be able to pick those things up as you continue in choir. Remember, joining a small group means making a commitment to being there as often as possible.

Some things to remember:

- ◆Choir focuses on DOING rather than OBSERVING.
- ◆Choir helps develop concepts of teamwork and cooperation.
- ◆Choir is a gift that will last a lifetime.

These are but a few reasons to join the choir and I hope you will consider joining our family. We meet on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 pm in the sanctuary.


first S.T.A.R.S. event in over a year! A generous donor has made lunch FREE for everyone, but we will take donations to go to the Christian Mission.

On May 20, 2021, the Celebrate Recovery leaders met for fellowship, a business meeting, and this topic: MOVING FORWARD. Our Training Coach, Patsy C., used this topic to help us avoid a decline and seek renewed growth in our Celebrate Recovery ministry. She emphasized these six stages of decline:

- 1) we become too comfortable
- 2) the status quo is celebrated
- 3) complacency sets in
- 4) mediocrity sets in
- 5) decay begins
- 6) the ministry has its funeral. This last one is a shocker!

Then, Patsy addressed the six stages of renewed growth:

- 1) reaching one more for Jesus as our number one purpose
- 2) past accomplishments are meant to build upon, not rest upon
- 3) ban "we have always done it this way" thinking
- 4) continue to look for new ways to stay fresh
- 5) new leaders continually growing in number
- 6) The ministry has a renewal! Now we're talking!

May we reap what we sow in a good way. Remember, there is always a delay in the harvest and the result is exponential. We will reap greater than we sow.
