BUT A BREATH

*Death be not proud, though some have called thee
Mighty and dreadful, for, thou art not soe,
For, those, whom thou think'st, thou dost overthrow,
Die not, poore death, nor yet canst thou kill mee;
From rest and sleepe, which but thy pictures bee,
Much pleasure, then from thee, much more must flow,
And soonest our best men with thee doe goe,
Rest of their bones, and soules deliverie.
Thou art slave to Fate, chance, kings, and desperate men,
And dost with poyson, warre, and sicknesse dwell,
And poppie, or charmes can make us sleepe as well,

(From *Holy Sonnets: Divine Meditations*)

As I contemplate on the state of the world, I find myself thinking about the end of life. As we hear more and more of the death toll rising and percentage increasing from COVID and we hear of the news of Afghanistan and what the Christian community there is beginning to face, I can't help but think about our faithfulness in dying well. James tells us life is but a vapor...here today and gone tomorrow. Jesus asks us to reflect on eternity, and how our lives on earth model the Kingdom with which we so align. Paul and Peter both romanticize the theme of death in doing well and living faithfully. Paul even told Timothy to share in suffering as a good soldier of Jesus Christ, and reminded him as well of the persecution which awaits the faithfulness of God. Yet despite the romanticism given to suffering and death in the early church, Paul also emphasizes the *defeat* of death through the atonement. Death, truly, be not proud.

These words echoed in the 17th century through the English poet, John Donne. Donne kindled the emotions of so many in his writings about salvation, spirituality, and death. When speaking of the last things of life the greatest peace Christians can have is in facing death for it is just a breath from eternity with Christ. So often we speak of how we live, and living well is so important; however, our true faithfulness is found in how well we die.

Peace can be ever about us for the most non-peaceful part of life, death, is no longer a threat to our lives for death has died. Hope can be the theme of our existence for we know death has been defeated, and death has no sting. Life, dear friends, is ever sweeter than honey when we are reminded of the eternity of our lives for death never truly knocks on our door for though today may be dark, tomorrow we will be in the ever illuminating presence of Christ our King.

Death is but a breath, and death be not proud for death has truly died. The present situation matters not for whatever we face today nothing is as severe as death; and, dear friends, death has been defeated by the cross and resurrection of Christ. Have hope dear friends, tomorrow is coming, and death be not proud for death has died.

It was several years later during a severe illness of his mother, that he penned these words of encouragement and comfort for her.

But, as this hymn of encouragement reminds us, we need to take it all to God in prayer. Jesus is always there, He is our savior, our refuge, and our friend. 

ENTERPRISE CELEBRATE RECOVERY

Do you ever feel as if your life is unmanageable? Romans 7:18 - “I know that nothing good lives in me, that is, in my sinful nature. For I have the desire to do good, but I cannot carry it out.”

Have you come to believe that only a power greater than yourself can restore you to sanity? Philippians 2:13 – For it is God who works in you to will and to act according to His good purpose.

Hurts? Habits? Hang-ups? Anxiety, financial struggles, perfectionism, balance between home and work, anger, marital relations, relationships at home or work, codependency, trust, food issues, alcohol and chemical dependency, and the list goes on and on - who doesn't have one or more?

Two years ago, I was approached following New Connection, and was asked if I was a veteran. “Yes”, I said, not realizing that one word would forever change my life. The follow-up question was whether I would be interested in leading a small group for military service members who possibly suffered from addictive behaviors related to PTSD, a program named Welcome Home. Again, “Yes” was the answer, (and another step closer to the change in my life). I was “on board”, never realizing what that meant. Next, I was told that there was a requirement to becoming a group leader – I had to complete a step-study. I honestly had no idea what that was, but did not hesitate – after all, working with veterans was a very good thing. So, in August 2019, I entered the room where the step study was being held – and there, around the table, were maybe 8 – 10 men, two of which were co-leaders and facilitators. I simply had “no clue”. As introductions were made around the table, men said their name, who they believed in, and the issue they were dealing with – you know, you’ve seen it – “Hello, my name is John, I’m a believer in Jesus Christ and I am struggling with codependency (or whatever).” When it was my turn, I *thought* to myself “I’m not one of you” and I simply said, “I am here because I have to do this to be a leader of small group.” About two weeks in, I quit... after all, I was not one of “these people”. Thanks to a couple of friends in the group, and to God who was telling me otherwise, I returned, and never looked back. I learned that “I am one of those people” – that I do have issues, and need God in every part of my life. About three weeks in, I determined trust to be a main issue in my life, and a couple of months later, figured out that relationships and financial management, or lack thereof, were perhaps central issues that I needed to turn over to God. I had crossed that hurdle – the hurdle that allowed me to understand that it is not a bad thing to admit there are issues in our lives – after all, God already knows – we are just catching up! God has moved to the place He should have always been in – FIRST in my life, and I cherish the moment I was asked, “Are you a Veteran?”

Think about your life – are there any areas in your life that you struggle with that are unmanageable? Are there areas that you pray to God for His help with – that you know you have to have help from a power greater than yourself? Do you pray that there is something that could help you deal with what you are going through?

Friends – that something and help already exist – our church is blessed to be the home of the Enterprise Celebrate Recovery, which meets every Tuesday night at 5:45 for dinner, and 6:25 for the large group session. If you missed my main point in my message here, I will state it clearly... Celebrate Recovery is here for ALL hurts, habits and hang-ups... If you have questions, PLEASE talk to me one-on-one, purely confidential – 334-447-8092.

Stewardship? Giving? Tithing?

Give 10 percent back to God for His work? I was once told to think about it in another way – God is giving me 90% of everything that is ultimately His, for all we are given comes from Him.

I once heard a motivation speaker address an audience regarding an attitude – an attitude of doing tasks in our lives. What he said was that he found himself saying “I HAVE to mow the lawn” and “I HAVE to go to work” and “I HAVE to take care of my family”, and “I HAVE to go to church”, and I “HAVE TO give generously to support the work and ministries of the church.” He had accepted the life of “HAVE TO’s” and his attitude reflected it. A friend of his was undergoing chemotherapy and related, “You HAD TO take chemotherapy”. And then that friend, said something that opened his eyes to his attitude, and told him that his look at life changed dramatically when he started saying “I GET TO take chemotherapy!” Imagine that... turning that treatment into a positive thing! What a change in outlook on life. Now, take each of the HAVE TO’S” and change them... “I GET TO mow the lawn”... “I GET TO go to work”... “I GET TO take care of my family”... “I GET TO go to church” and “I GET TO give generously to support the work and ministries of my church”. Can you see how powerful changing the HAVE TO’S to GET TO’S can be? This attitudinal change is totally in line with the Scripture, which is perhaps one of my favorites - **2 Corinthians 9:7 – “Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under any compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.”** When you “GET TO” give, you are giving CHEERFULLY, and God is smiling. You have made a **conscious decision** to support the ministries and programs of the church, and deemed them valuable to you personally and as a family, as well as to your fellow worshipers and to the community. And guess what? **You GET TO support them!** This leads me to another Scripture - **Deuteronomy 16:17 – “Every man shall give as he is able, according to the blessing of the Lord your God that he has given you.”** Again, if a man is giving, as he is able, based on the blessings he has received from God, he is truly “GETTING TO GIVE”, as it is willingly given, and is pleasing to God.



Finally, Philippians 2:13 tells us **“For it is God who works in you to will and to act according to His good purpose.”**
