Pastor Billy's Notes

GOD OF OUR FATHERS 1876

This hymn communicates a feeling of patriotism and the greatness of God. This patriotic hymn represents a double celebration of America's one hundredth birthday. The words were written in 1876 by a New England pastor in honor of the one hundredth anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. The music was written twelve years later in celebration of the one hundredth anniversary of the adoption of the United States Constitution.

Daniel Crain Roberts, a 34-year-old veteran of the civil war, authored the words. Born on Long Island in New York in 1841, Daniel attended college in Ohio and served as a private with the 84th Ohio volunteers during the War Between the States. As the war ended, he was ordained as a deacon in the Presbyterian Episcopalian church, and shortly afterwards as a priest. He served the next thirty years pastoring Episcopalian churches in New England.

The majestic melody was not the one to which it was originally sung. When Daniel wrote "God of Our Fathers," he set the words to the tune of the Russian National Anthem! It was twelve years later that George William Warren, a self-taught organist composed its stately tune with its trumpet fanfares. It was called NATIONAL HYMN, written to commemorate the one hundredth anniversary of the U.S. Constitution.

George Warren, lacking in formal training, had pursued a business career. But his natural talent soon moved him into music, and he became one of America's premier organists. When George Warren died in 1902, there was a feeling that no organist could play as well as he could, so not a single note of music was played at his funeral, which was attended by thousands.

¹¹Now on his way to Jerusalem, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. ¹²As he was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy met him. They stood at a distance ¹³and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!" ¹⁴When he saw them, he said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed. ¹⁵One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. ¹⁶He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him—and he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? ¹⁸Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹Then he said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well." Luke 17:11-19 (NIV)

Jesus was willing to heal these broken men of their leprosy. Ten men walked away. One turned back, remembering what had happened in his life and that Jesus did the healing. "Where are the other nine?" asked Jesus.

Jesus honored the former leper's praise and adoration because this man was not only thrilled to be free of his affliction, but also filled with gratitude toward the One who had healed him.

Coming to Celebrate Recovery is not just returning to a place to have God "Take care of what I struggle with." It is much bigger than that. He wants a relationship with us as we face our struggles and pains. Verse 19 says, "And [Jesus] said to him, 'Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well.'" It was his faith in God and willingness to praise God that brought *continued* healing.

May we walk our Christian walk today with appreciation and gratitude toward the God who Heals. It's easy to react with, "I got what I came for...I have other things to do now." Living life in continuous gratitude and thankfulness to the God we serve is our calling...no matter what we choose to do next.

God is working miracles in the EFUMC Celebrate Recovery ministry. We are so thankful to be able to send eight leaders in person to the Celebrate Recovery 30th Anniversary Summit in Dallas, TX, July 21-23, 2021. Twelve more leaders are to attend virtually. As expected, our church is filling up with those hungry for healing. May we be as the one in Luke 17 who returned with faith and willingness to praise God!
