This will be the first Mother's Day without my Mom. Mom passed on November 23, 2020, at 87 years of age, and I miss her very much. There was always something special between Mom and I and she was my hero.

Being a Mom brings out the absolute best in women, and I believe it is the highest calling from God to be a Mom. It requires the greatest responsibilities and the highest priorities.

Recently, a study took place that attempted to describe the value of a mother in monetary ways. By selecting a handful of jobs that reflect a day in the life of a Mom and pulling the market compensation data for those same roles, a study determined that the median annual salary of a mother for 2018 is \$162,581 rising nearly \$5,000 from 2017 calculations. In addition to traditional roles like performing the duties of a cook, housekeeper, nurse, and nutritionist, Moms of today have more responsibilities than ever before. For example, with the rise of technology, Moms are expected to sharpen their knowledge around computers, tablets, smartphones, and social media – making them extremely well-rounded in their skillsets and very valuable in terms of earning potential.

How would you measure the priceless quality of a woman who is a Godly mother? It is impossible to total up the value. Money cannot buy a Mom! There is no price tag that could equate to the influence she has and what a Christian mother can do. Yes, my Mom was a hero to me, and she taught me countless things. She awakened the gift of music within me, which helped lead to my life's calling into the music ministry. She taught me love and respect, she taught me discipline, sometimes with a switch (OUCH!!!), but most of all, she taught me the love of God.

So, if your Mom is still living, make this the greatest Mother's Day you possibly can. Hug and love on her all you can. Be sure to tell her that she is your hero!!!

The Ripple Effect



The EFUMC ministry Celebrate Recovery has a ripple effect on the world all around us. By that I mean we are part of a bigger plan that God has for us, our community, and the world. A life significantly changed by Celebrate Recovery will be noticed by others. If we stay faithful to our calling, they will see Christ in us; they will seek to know Christ better; and they will share this good news with others.

My Celebrate Recovery sponsor became extremely important in my life 10 years ago. By helping me see the truth of my past and by being a constant mentor, she disciplined me into a stronger faith that was noticed by others who struggled. In turn, I have sponsored other women whose lives have crossed my path. Some of those women have embraced the program and now have their own sponsees. And so it continues: the ripple effect. But imagine this . . . my sponsee has also sponsored many other women, each one with her own ripple effect.

Sometimes we hear back from a participant about the effect that Celebrate Recovery has had in his or her life. Denver received the following letter (not printed in its entirety) that illustrates just one of the many ripples of his prison ministry:

Denver,

I wanted to let you know that I believe your recommendation helped me to be released from prison a full 10 months early. I know that God was in charge and believe this is his blessing for doing his work while inside.

One of the men who was instrumental in the continuation of the CR program at Suwannee has just reached out to me. I'm certain this is proof that God wants me to encourage Celebrate Recovery inside. I am establishing a prison ministry so that my friends and family can help.

I don't even know what I don't know yet, but I know CR inside works and God wants me involved. I am thankful to now be a prisoner of God and the help you gave us in the beginning of CR inside.

God bless and thank you again.

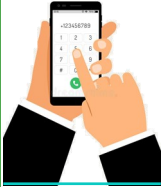
